

Principles of Valuation (POV) PP/GJ 204

The Legal and Regulatory Environment

COURSE OVERVIEW

POV PP/GJ 204 introduces program participants to compliance with laws and regulations in order for them to conduct their appraisal practices. As part of the class, participants develop a Fair Market Value oral appraisal report for the property that they appraised in PP/GJ POV 203. Participants are therefore required to bring their appraisal reports from POV 203 and full workfiles to this class.

Prerequisites for POV 204 include the successful completion of POV PPGJ 201, 202 and 203.

TOPICS INCLUDED IN POV PP/GJ 204

- Professional ethics and standards
- Expanded applications of Fair Market Value
- Insights into the auction market
- The auction arena
- The insurance industry
- Court system, tort law and the appraiser's role
- Legal precedents (court cases) on which some appraisal guidance is based
- Government regulations

CLASSROOM REQUIREMENTS

Participants need to bring to class a copy of their appraisal report completed in PP/GJ POV 203 together with the entire appraisal workfile and their Letter of Agreement (or contract).

A copy of the *Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice 2012-13 (USPAP)*, either as a *hard* copy or downloaded.
